Bouquet prints are created with traditional and digital drawing tools. Each petal and flower in the bouquet is hand drawn and painted using these tools and then assembled into a bouquet design. The prints are original digital media printed on specialty paper with archival inks. They are typically printed in an edition of 100. Each print is hand-signed by me and framed. Some may be available as prints only.

Ted Hollander

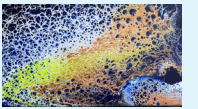

Kenneth Litwack

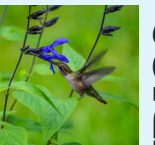
Fused glass. My work consists mostly of abstract landscapes and portraits which are created in my home studio. Most of the portraits are made up of thousands of individually cut squares of glass.

M J. Newman

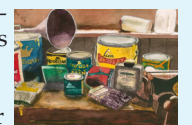

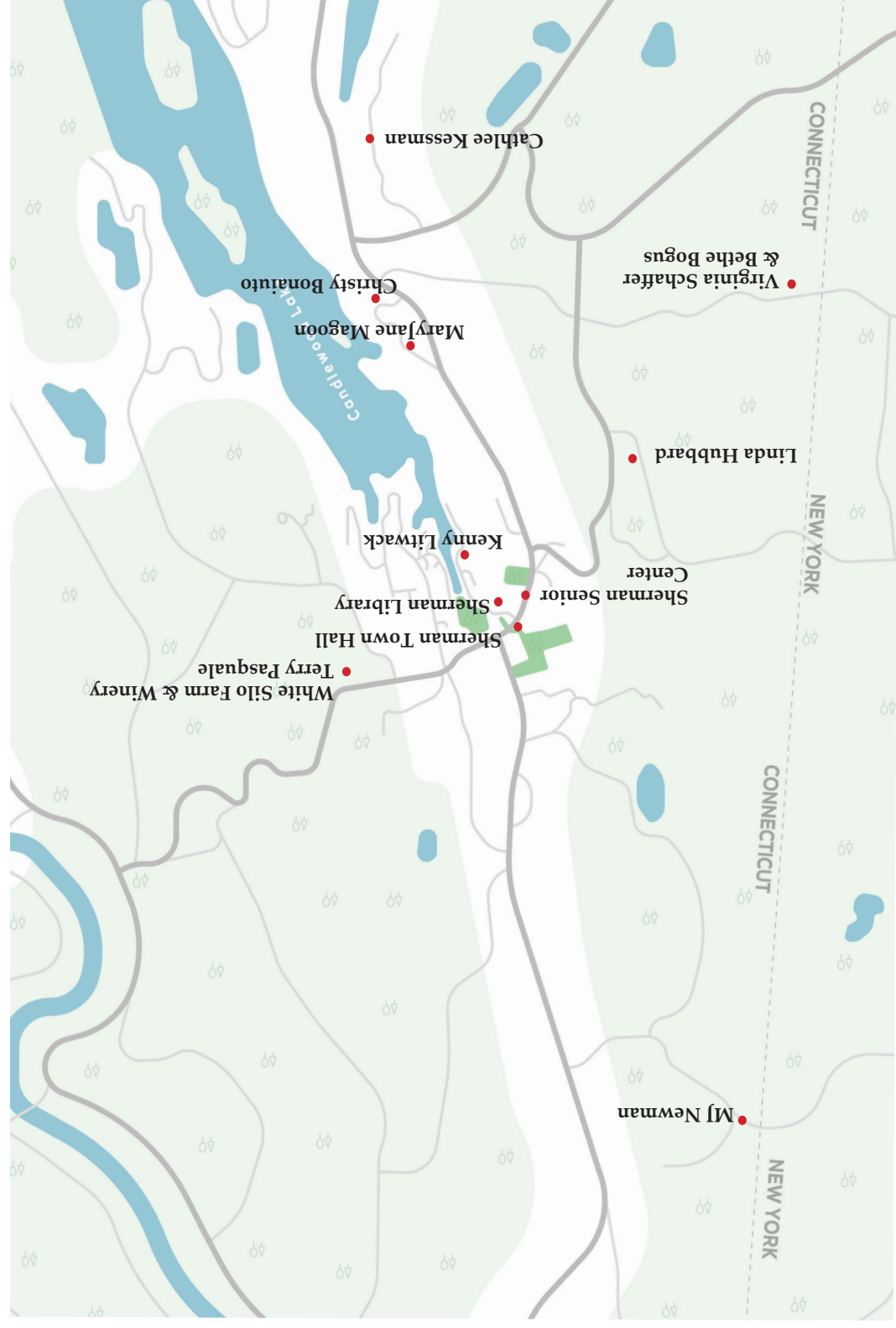
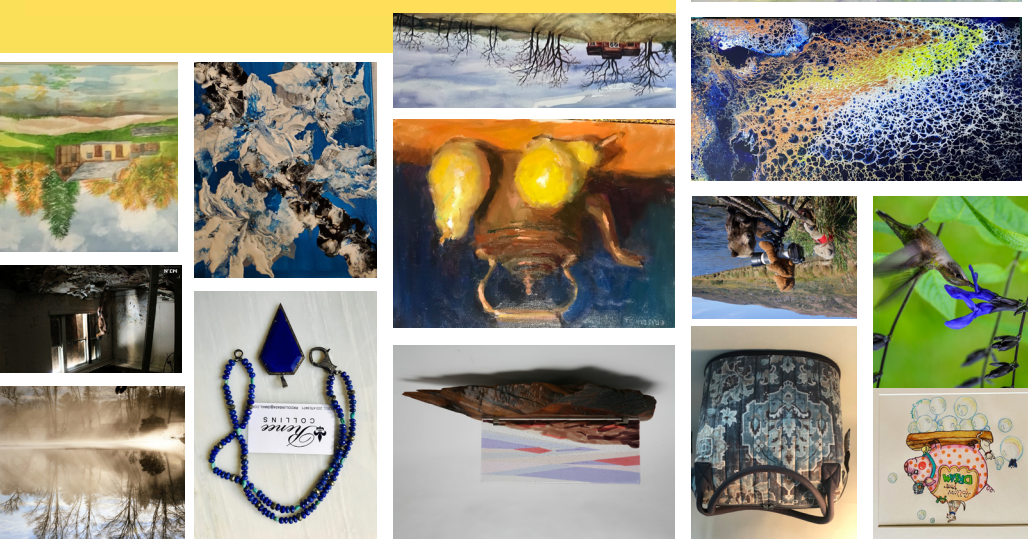
